I recently found a diary I kept when I was in 6th grade. Each entry begins "Dear Diary" and then I go on to describe the mostly banal events of the day, ending with a comment on my love life. Most days it's "Not much happened in my love life today," which is what one would expect from a 6th grader, but it seems as if I was hoping for more. My kids, especially Carly, got a kick out of the diary.

It Gets Better

Despite the lack of an exciting love life, 6th grade was a great year for me: I had a big role in the 6th grade play, my classmates voted me "Best Sense of Humor", and I did have my first girlfriend – even if it was only for a couple of weeks. 6th grade was the last year of Elementary school. I had been going there since kindergarten and knew the hallways and classrooms well enough to walk them blindfolded. I knew all the teachers, I knew all the students, friends were everywhere. It was wonderful.

But then 7th grade came, Jr. High. The school was on the other side of town. I had to take a long bus ride to get there. Kids from five different elementary schools came together to make a class of over 400 kids, most of whom I didn't know. I felt shy and unsure of myself. But lots of other kids loved it. Some of my friends, people I had grown up with thrived. They met new people and made new friends. And this made me feel even more disconnected.

To make matters worse, my family moved during Jr High. Not far, I still went to the same school on the other side of town, but out of the neighborhood I had grown up in, away from my friends that I had known since kindergarten and even earlier. Jr. High was a lonely, difficult time. I wondered if I would ever feel the warmth and joy that I knew when I was younger. This experience I went through is not unique. I'm not sure if it was clinical depression or something else, but lots of people go through tough, dark times in their lives. Sometimes it's triggered by the circumstances they are going through. Sometimes it's caused by brain chemistry. Puberty likely had something to do with my rough adolescent years. But regardless of the cause, there is hope. It *does* get better.

A few years ago there was a campaign aimed at LGBT (lesbian, gay, bi-sexual, and transgendered) youth. Many famous people, from Barak Obama to Stephen Colbert, as well as non-famous people like firemen and women from the New York City Fire Department, made videos and put them on YouTube – all with the message that *it gets better*. These videos are aimed at LGBT youth, who often get bullied and have higher rates of depression and suicide. But this message of hope is something all of us need to hear from time to time.

We are in the season of Advent now. It's a dark time with short days and long nights. But rest assured it will get better. Light is coming. Christmas will soon be here. There will be friends, closeness and good times again. Joy is out there for you. For me it came a little bit in high school, and then more in college, and now in abundance with my family at home and at Emanuel.

At Christmas we celebrate God coming into the world in the form of a baby born in a manger. From this the love of God for all people was, and is still, made known. We are a part of something larger than ourselves. We are children of God. And because of this, there is always hope.
