Who is Emanuel Lutheran Church?

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Last year the church council set a 5 year goal to have our neighbors (the people of West Warwick) know who we are, what we do, and what we stand for as a congregation. Our hope is to be a positive force in the community and have people know that Emanuel is a safe, caring place where they can find refuge.

To help us get a handle on what the people of West Warwick know about Emanuel, a group of us went out into the community last month and asked people to take short survey about Emanuel and the impression they have of our church.

The survey consisted of 5 questions:

- (1.) We are from Emanuel Lutheran Church in West Warwick. Have you ever heard of it?
- (2.) If no, have you ever heard of the Joyful Noise early learning center?

If you have heard of Emanuel, what's your impression of the church:

positive negative or neutral?

- (3.) Have you ever been to Emanuel in West Warwick? If so, what did you go there for?
- (4.) Did you know that Emanuel is a church that welcomes all people including gay, lesbian, transgender and straight people?
- (5.) Did you know that Emanuel has a weekly food pantry for people in need?

A total of 37 people took the survey, most of them at the West Warwick Community Appreciation Day at Riverside Park. Here's a summary of the results:

TOTAL = 37

Heard of Emanuel? YES = 11 (30%) NO = 26 (70%) Heard of Joyful Noise? YES = 26 (70%) NO = 12 (30%)

People who heard of Emanuel TOTAL = 11

Impression? Positive = 5 (46%) Neutral 6 (54%) Negative = 0 Yes, knew this = 6 (54%) Didn't know = 5 (46%) Yes, knew this = 6 (54%) Didn't know = 5 (46%)

2 of the 11 people had been to Emanuel: one for a baptism, one as a Brownie troop leader.

I'm not sure if this is a large enough or varied enough sample to draw definitive conclusions from, but a few things jump out to me.

First, that not many people in West Warwick know about Emanuel. 70% had never even heard of us. Second, a lot more people have heard of Joyful Noise. Perhaps because they have two locations: Emanuel and Christ the King Church, or maybe because they are open 5 days a week. Whatever the reason, it makes clear that we should try harder to make a connection with Joyful Noise families. And finally, none of the people, who know about Emanuel, have a negative impression of us. This is a good thing – to know us is to love us (or at least be neutral about us).

If we want our neighbors to know who we are, what we do, and what we stand for, then we'll need to tell or show people what we are about. We should consider advertising and getting more involved with community events (like the West Warwick Community Appreciation Day). We should invite people to come and use our facilities for community events. We should talk more to our friends and neighbors about Emanuel. We should let people know who Emanuel is.

But who are we? Who is Emanuel Lutheran Church? If someone came up to you and asked this, what would you say?

The first time we went out into the community and asked people to take the survey, people asked about Emanuel: where is it? when are services? when is the food pantry open? The next time we went out we were prepared. We brought cards with our address and service times, I also put together a sheet that attempted to answer the question - who are we as a congregation? This is what I wrote:

Who is Emanuel Lutheran Church?

We are a group of people who gather on a hill in the Crompton section of West Warwick each Sunday to worship the God that's revealed in Jesus Christ.

We are sinners. We are also children of God, who are loved and who have been forgiven. This affects how we see the world, how we see others, and how we live our lives. In each person we see a child of God, and we strive to live lives of gratitude.

Each Tuesday from 10AM to 12PM we have a food pantry to help anyone who is in need. We have a sewing circle that meets each Tuesday at this same time, which makes blankets for sick children at HASBRO. Emanuel is a partner of Joyful Noise early learning

center, which has been hosted in our building since 1978. Emanuel is also part of the New England GreenStart program, which means we pay for all our electricity to come from renewable sources like wind, solar, and hydroelectric.

Emanuel is part of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America. We were founded in 1886 by Swedish immigrants, who worked in West Warwick's mills. Until the 1930's worship services were held in Swedish. Since 1943 all services have been in English.

Emanuel has two worship services on Sundays: 8AM and 10:30AM. Sunday school begins at 9:15AM. Choir practice begins at 9:15AM

All are welcome to sing in the choir, and all are welcome to join us for worship or Sunday school. If you have any questions, please call (401) 821-8888 or email – pastor@emanuelww.org.

Each of us would probably answer this question a little differently - who we are as church together. But however you would answer it, our goal is to share with everyone the love of God we know in Jesus. We are children of God. We are a group of people who "do justice, love mercy, and walk humbly with our God." (Micah 6:8) Let us use our voices and our actions to make God's love known throughout our neighborhood and the world.

FEEDING THE HUNGRY

I have been managing the Food Cupboard at Emanuel since it started for a dozen or so years now. Over the years I as well as others have noticed that most of our Patrons were more needy than hungry. Over the years I



have heard many comments towards these people. Some of the comments I have thought about myself.

They have more food than I have as they hit all the food cupboards

They are able to work why don't they buy their food

I wouldn't eat the food we give out

They only take the name brand food so they aren't hungry

They probably sell it and buy alcohol

Now these comments aren't maliciously or hatefully stated. They were just said without thinking about it. Small talk and not in front of our patrons.

This started me to thinking and I wanted to investigate a little. I visited other food cupboards as a requirement of the RI Food Bank application process. Many of these food Banks offer food and have strict requirements. Some you have to make under \$13,000 a year but if you do make under and get assistance from another agency you can't get food there.

With this being said I would like to offer a few stories of some of our patrons without their names. Think about them. There are so many with stories. Even though they look fit they are terribly hurt and broken.

- Mrs. X It is very hard for her to make ends meet. She is a nice lady and looks very able. But you see she suffers from emotional problems which inhibit her from doing things like working. A number of years ago a member of her family with severe depression killed her children in front of her and then shot her in the chest.
- Mr. Z A very nice proud man. Pleasant to talk to and looks very able. What you don't see is a man who at one time worked, but one day at work had a nail shot into his brain limiting what he can do.
- Mr. Y You can tell by talking with him he is educated but he is homeless. A number of vehicle accidents caused head injuries. He was put on heavy medication and became addicted.

Working with Teen Challenge I could tell dozens of stories that they witnessed with me. We need to look beneath the surface or rather not look at all.

I am proud to say at Emanuel's Food Pantry we have NO requirements. Everyone who feels they are in need is able to get food. The poor, needy, and even those who are working, but cant make it that week. EVERYBODY GETS FOOD.

Please continue to support Emanuel's Food Pantry AS THE NEED IS GREAT.

EMANUEL LUTHERAN CHURCH NEW OUTREACH

We have been asked to help a large group of individuals. They are Senior's living in subsidized housing and many are disabled. 170 residents in total. The Church Council has authorized our food Cupboard to help them via a soup kitchen.

After much research, time, and meetings we will start this in December. The best way to help them and others is to partner with a 501c3 organization called Be The Change. It is located on Brookside Ave. in Artic. They presently provide meals each Sunday to about 50 needy and homeless persons. The seniors I mentioned are on the bus route to this location and have started coming for the meals. It is best that we do this outreach with them as they already have it in place and are located in the ideal location right where the persons in need are and where others can access their meals. They provide a meal each Sunday at supper time as well as offer nonperishable food, toiletries etc.

There is also a Catering truck that provides meals in Artic to those in need. St. John The Baptist Church provides a meal on Tuesdays three times a month. Emanuel will be providing a meal on the Third Tuesday of each month. The Tuesday that St. Johns doesn't.

We need to stop the duplication of effort and work as a team in the community.

HOW IT WORKS

On the third Sunday of the month I am asking that parishioners make food in foil pans, bring to Church on Sunday and store in the refrigerator in the Fellowship Hall kitchen. I will heat the food and deliver to Be The Change Tuesday afternoon. You can call me at 860-465-7347 Saturdays and let me know what you can provide. This is important as in this way I will know what I need to provide to make sure we have enough. I am also in need of several persons to serve the food on Tuesday night and will need to know if you can attend.

MENU

We will be making a specific menu on the third Tuesday of the month. Bread and butter, Macaroni and meatballs, Beans and Franks , soda, coffee, tea, desert. Paper plates, plastic ware, cups, napkins.

As relayed to me by the staff at Be The Change - it is important to remember when making the desserts that they be soft foods as many of these persons have no teeth or bad teeth, which makes it hard for them to chew, e.g. Cakes, puddings, soft brownies etc. This is also why we have a specific menu to make. They also recommend soda as the beverage as this is what the people want and it is something they do not readily get.

Council Agenda and Minutes

October 13, 2016 at 7:00 PM

<u>Present:</u> Gwen Andersen, Pam Beck, Myron Gadoury, Beth Groleau, Lee Jacobs, Bruce Johnson, Disa Johnson, Glenn Johnson, Helen Maine, Walter Phaneuf, Kathy Plante, Pastor Todd, Donna Sennett, Margaret Teehan, and Ken Wieboldt.

Absent: Sharon Brown, Carolyn Duprey (vacation)

The meeting was called to order at 7:02 p.m.

- 1. Opening devotions: Read Chapter 9 Really Good Church by Rev. Molly Phinney Baskette.
 - a. Pastor Todd prepared a list of questions for us to discuss (How exciting is worship at Emanuel? How authentic/real is worship at Emanuel?)
 - b. A few highlights from the discussion:
 - i. People like when Chuck sets a context for the music. Now that our readings are different, we also like when someone sets the context for the lessons and how they are related (somewhat like Dan McCarthy did the last time he was the reader).
 - ii. We like having kids and different adults help with the jobs --- like collecting the offering, helping with communion, filling in where they are needed.
 - iii. What about people who can't participate in the service because they are going blind or are deaf, or have some other handicapping condition? What can we do to help them be active participants?

Accepted

- Review and Accept September Minutes
- 3. Review and Accept September Treasurer's report Accepted
- 4. Budget status and spending levels
 - a. Most people are up-to-date on their pledges.
 - b. We are still short of having enough funds to fully fund the budget. We have deliberately under spent the budget, and we still have had to borrow about \$7000 from ourselves from funds that were earmarked for other things. We may also need to borrow from our savings again to meet payroll and other obligations.
 - c. We will be in deficit unless we get some extra money coming in. What should the Council do now to raise more money? We said at the annual meeting that we would need extra fund-raisers to meet the church budget this year.
 - i. We should let the congregation know about the situation --- perhaps by posting a thermometer to show the congregation about where our income stands compared to our budget... Bruce will look into preparing such a visual to post at church.

- ii. Perhaps put the Treasurer's Report in the bulletin, in the newsletter, on the bulletin board... or use a simplified version.
- iii. Maybe we need someone to do a verbal explanation of the problem.
- iv. If everyone gave one extra week's offering by any means, we would get about half of what we need to add at this time.
- v. From now on update the congregation on a regular basis, perhaps on a monthly or quarterly basis... This would be our third quarter report.
- vi. Request that **Carol Johnson** draft a simplified report to explain the "financial forecast" for the month to the Council in a form that can also be shared with the congregation.

Resolution: Have the thermometer ready and have a talk on October 23. Ken Wieboldt will do the verbal presentation with help from some others. Inform the congregation. Work with Mike Gadoury to have a graphic on the screen --- probably the thermometer visual, and ask that we update it and continue to use it each week as part of the slide show before the service.

- 5. Congregation support of budget: (See 4.c above).
- 6. Council help at Oct. 23 post-worship luncheon
 - a. Glenn did fill out a function form for the event. He will do a temple talk on October 16.
 - b. Some Council members will not be available to help on that day.
- 7. Westcott Terrace (See attached information). Approved to do this at the expected expense of \$50 a week. This also depends on Myron's passing the test to get the appropriate qualifications.
 - a. We were ASKED to do this, and it fits in with our goal to extend our outreach into the community.
 - b. Myron asked that we include \$3600 a year for the food budget for 2017.
 - c. Myron thinks it will cost about \$50 a week to do the Westcott Terrace project.
 - d. We will need volunteers to help at 2 p.m. on Tuesdays. We have a volunteer from Pilgrim Lutheran and will ask Pastor Tourgee from Riverpoint Advent Christian Church if there are people there who could also help.
 - e. The food will be made from food we are able to purchase from the RI Food Bank at a reduced cost.
 - f. Donna Sennett will write a Thrivent Action Plan to support this when Myron gets it organized.
- 8. Separate activity insert in bulletin: There is a need for a bulletin insert that lists the different activities occurring at Emanuel. Often there is not enough room on the back of the bulletin to list them all. A separate insert has been done already for this week.
- 9. Other
 - a. Reviewed Function forms. Question: Do we need to have a function form a month in advance so that the Council can approve it? Not necessarily ... get the information from the church office, speak to the pastor and make sure there is a plan for clean-up. The council reviews upcoming events to make sure there are no conflicts, to make sure there is a cleanup plan. For church events there also should be a setup and advertising plans.

- b. Doing Survey this Saturday: "Will you take a 30-second survey to help my church?" Pastor Todd listed the volunteers (Glenn Johnson, Kathy Plante, Beverly Locke, Sissy Hendricks) who will help him and where they hope to go. He will call businesses this week to ask permission to conduct the surveys on their property.
- c. Wendy Aylsworth would like to become an Associate Member (non-voting member) at Emanuel.

 Approved
- d. We got cited by our recycling company for having garbage in the recycling bins. There is one dumpster for garbage, and another for cardboard. The smaller bins are for mixed recyclables such as paper, and bottles, and cans. (The problems were diapers from the daycare, and coffee hour trash. Joyful will inform their staff and we will inform coffee hour people. Not discussed at the meeting, but Beth will make an announcement at church to inform everyone, because she thinks she may be partly responsible.
- e. Myron planned to polyurethane the staircase off the parish hall on November 11. Council told him to delay that until after the Bazaar, even if it means that the job doesn't get done this year. (We need the Bazaar to be a successful fundraiser and many people have been preparing for it, so we do not want any odors to hamper the event.)
- f. The Sunday after the bazaar (November 13), Myron will polyurethane the parish hall after everyone leaves. The parish hall will/may be blocked off from use for the following week so that it dries and no one spoils the finish by walking on it. If we mechanically block the doors Myron will work with the fire marshal to make sure we meet fire protection requirements and get the fire marshal's approval.
- g. Myron reported that the bell wiring has been completed. He also reported that the repairs are now fully funded through donations and fund-raisers. Thank you!
- h. Myron called Rob Burton, "The Tree Guy" to give an estimate about cutting trees and brush for the Joyful playground at Joyful's expense. He will charge \$1600 for that work and will also cut overhanging /dead branches over the parsonage and at the church entrance for an additional \$300.00 while he is here. (That is about \$5000 of work for \$1900.) The Daycare will pay \$1600.00 for the playground work. Rob used to be a member here, and is helping us.
- At the Council's request, Myron brought in someone to give his impressions of our church as a visitor. We began discussing his report, but will continue at a later date.
- j. Donna Sennett thanked the Council for the \$200 we allocated to help her pay for the School of Lay Ministry.

The meeting adjourned with the Lord's Prayer at 8:55 p.m. Next meeting: Nov. 10, 2016
