### Do You See the Miracles in Your Life?

Jesus was talking with his disciples when people began to bring their children to Jesus to bless them. The disciples told them to go away, Jesus was busy. But Jesus said, "Let the little children come, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these." Luke 18:15-17.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I'm often mystified by our kids and their friends. It's not uncommon for me to come upon four or five of them sitting next to each other, but not speaking or even looking at each other. Rather they all have their heads down engrossed in a cell phone or some other device.

This is not unique to our kids or even recent times. Back in 2005, when I was entering seminary in Philadelphia, I waited in the registration line with 30 or so of my fellow seminarians. Many of them stood there with cell phones in hand talking or texting, or had earbuds in their ears listening to music. All of us were about to spend the next couple of years together at seminary, and there we stood in line not talking to each other.

It can be hard to connect to someone you don't know. You have to figure out how to start a conversation with them. There can be awkward moments of silence. You don't know how they are going to respond. It's much easier to pull out your phone and turn it on. And then in the palm of your hand you have technology with almost limitless possibilities. You can look-up just about anything on the internet, there are billions of videos, movies, and TV shows to watch, and almost every song ever recorded is out there for your listening pleasure. It's no wonder people often disappear into their phones, when they find themselves waiting in line with strangers, or even in a room with friends, when there is an awkward silence and no one knows what to say.

This tendency to retreat into our own technological worlds was noted in a recent forum titled "Repairing the Breach" aimed at getting Americans of different political persuasions (liberal & conservative) to speak with one another. One of the speakers, Heather McGee, suggested that, "We both need to embrace the limitless possibilities of technology, **and** reaffirm the limitless possibilities of the human being next to us."

Yes, the internet is amazing. Through it a gigantic breadth of the world's knowledge is now accessible to much of humanity. But the person sitting next to you, or standing in line in front of you – is also amazing. They are a collection of about 7 Octillion  $(7x10^{27})$  atoms, that are always changing, always turning over. In fact, if we stand next to a person, it's very likely some of their atoms will become part of us, and some of our atoms will become part of them. Most of the atoms that make up a person today will not be there next year. And yet, somehow those atoms that are here today are all working together to be that person next to you. Who are they? What is their history? Where are they from? What are their hopes and dreams? The possibilities are limitless. They are a miracle.

And yet, these miracles, the people in our lives are always changing, and not just at an atomic level. I've been at Emanuel long enough now to know that things change. People leave, they move away, people die. Change is one of the things we can count on. And this is true for friends and even family. At different times in our lives we will find ourselves surrounded by different groups of people.

This reality of change and loss can be sad, but it also means that there is something very special about the people in our lives right now. The spiritual teacher Jeff Foster writes:

"You will lose everything. Your money, your power, your fame, your success, perhaps even your memories. Your looks will go. Loved ones will die. Your body will fall apart. Everything that seems permanent is impermanent and will be smashed. Experience will gradually, or not so gradually, strip away everything that it can strip away. Waking up means facing this reality with open eyes and no longer turning away.

But right now, we stand on sacred and holy ground, for that which will be lost has not yet been lost, and realizing this is the key to unspeakable joy. Whoever or whatever is in your life right now has not yet been taken away from you. This may sound trivial, obvious, like nothing, but really it is the key to everything, the why and how and wherefore of existence.

Impermanence has already rendered everything and everyone around you so deeply holy and significant and worthy of your heartbreaking gratitude. Loss has already transfigured your life into an altar."

The people in our lives today – our families, our friends, the stranger in line in front of us – are gifts from God. They are miracles.

"Let the little children come, and do not hinder them..." Jesus says.

Embrace the holiness of this moment. Embrace the people who God has put in our lives today.

I am not asking anyone to do this on a regular basis but rather from time to time, so I may attend to other areas of food acquisition.

Upcoming Orientation dates are April 11 10am - 12 noon and April 27 12 noon - 2pm

I also make other trips to other locations each week to get more foods which makes Tuesdays a very long day. These trips I will handle myself.

We are trying to extend our days/hours of food distribution to make available on evenings. With that being said I am also looking for more volunteers to stock and distribute food from the food cupboard.

### We're looking for people who would be willing to help setup and host coffee hour.




No experience needed.
