Emanuel Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes March 14, 2024

Attendees: Ken Wieboldt, Sue Wieboldt, Myron Gadoury, Ray Nunez, Donna Sennett, Pastor Todd Stange, Bruce Johnson

Absent: Mark Melanson, Marcia Melanson, Jack Gibbs

Opening Devotions

There was a nomination for Donna Sennett to continue on as secretary and she agreed to retain the position of Council Secretary.

Motion to accept the March Council meeting minutes by Pastor Todd. Motion seconded by Bruce Johnson

Annual Meeting notes had some changes, which were made with others to follow. The changed annual meeting notes will be presented to the Council in advance of the April Council Meeting for approval at that meeting.

Budget: There was a question about line item 505 in regard to an amount of \$4,015.65. Was this an actual expenditure? Ken indicated that he thought this section was just a work space for Carol, but Carol will be asked about it.

Todd will send out an updated 2024 Monthly Giving Report with updated figures. There was also discussion regarding the YTD Actual Monthly Shortfall/Excess of -\$511.23. Ray pointed out that we actually have a \$3800 shortfall for 2024 to date if we don't count the carryover amount which was positive, thereby creating a shortfall amounting to the \$3800 figure. It was felt by the Council that the positive amount of the carryover should be included, resulting in the shortfall of \$511.23.

Christian Education: We have three confirmands this year, Confirmation Sunday is on May 19th. Olivia Santori is going to let Pastor know if she can direct Drama Camp this year.

Property: No questions. Myron has not gotten the results of the air sampling yet. The Daycare has never washed the floor downstairs. JN states that the custodian will not clean them. However, they should keep the floors washed and will need to come up with a solution to this issue.

Myron needs to put a bulkhead on the door with panic hardware. The door is \$2300 installed. He got a quote for a laminate floor in the kitchen of \$2,080. That includes installation.

The sinkhole will be filled this Saturday.

There was an accident with an Amazon truck damaging the cement pylon in the parking lot and Myron put in a claim for \$400, which Amazon agreed to pay. The pylon will need to stay up in that area from now on with no vehicle traffic in that area. There will be a separate parking spot for deliveries to the DayCare.

We will need will need to do the parking lot at some point in the future, but Myron states that it will be extremely expensive, possibly as much as \$150,000.

There are still issues with parents and how unsafe their driving is in the parking lot during dropoff and pickup times.

Worship and Music: They are getting ready for Holy Week. Pastor is looking at sermon series for this summer.

Annual Meeting Attendance: There was a discussion regarding attendance and voting members. Pastor feels there should be some mechanism to distinguish voting members only should there be a close vote. Myron feels that there should be something to distinguish voting members from non-voting members at all annual meetings. Myron made a motion that all those attending the Annual Meeting be identified if they are voting members or not. It was not seconded. Ray feels that people could be checked off if there is a member or not during the course of the meeting, but not approached separately. The majority of the Council feels that the membership list should be made available in case there is a close vote.

Council Planning Meeting (Retreat): Most people felt that they would rather doing a meeting during the day and not overnight.: Proposed dates are May 4th and June 1st. Ken will send out a request for availability for each of those dates to the Council members. We will also consider meeting from 9:00-12:00, then lunch, then 1:00-3:00. The purpose is for short-term and long-term planning. Ken will also send out a request for topics to be discussed. Pastor thinks we might discuss that we revisit the congregation's mission statement. Myron suggested that we discuss how to go about having the parking lot repaired/paved. Ray also suggested that we discuss ongoing use of the parsonage for housing unhoused people. Myron would like to have us consider that Eric Johnson be allowed to live upstairs following the departure of its current residents. Eric would pay the church \$500.00 a month to live upstairs.

What to do with a \$12,000 gift: Myron suggested we put a new floor in the kitchen and purchase the new door. Pastor felt that we should do a building improvement and put the other half into the endowment fund. There was a consensus that the door and the kitchen floor be done and the remaining \$6000 be put in the Endowment Fund. Myron made a motion to accept and Sue seconded the motion.

Use of Endowment Fund: We are still looking for suggestions on places to donate. Myron suggested that we donate to a camp called Camp Sunshine in Maine.

Calumet: Myron is going to speak with the Food Bank families to see if they know of children who might want to go to Calumet. Ken suggested that we could possibly rent a van to transport registered children.

Next Council meeting scheduled for April 11, 2024.

Bible Readings for Sunday April 14th

First Reading

Acts 2:22-24, 37-47

After the Holy Spirit comes upon the disciples Peter boldly proclaims the gospel and many become followers of Jesus' way.

²² 'You that are Israelites, listen to what I have to say: Jesus of Nazareth, a man attested to you by God with deeds of power, wonders, and signs that God did through him among you, as you yourselves know— ²³this man, handed over to you according to the definite plan and foreknowledge of God, you crucified and killed by the hands of those outside the law. ²⁴But God raised him up, having freed him from death, because it was impossible for him to be held in its power.

³⁷ Now when they heard this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and to the other apostles, 'Brothers, what should we do?' ³⁸Peter said to them, 'Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ so that your sins may be forgiven; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. ³⁹For the promise is for you, for your children, and for all who are far away, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to him.' ⁴⁰And he testified with many other arguments and exhorted them, saying, 'Save yourselves from this corrupt generation.' ⁴¹So those who welcomed his message were baptized, and that day about three thousand persons were added. ⁴²They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers.

⁴³ Awe came upon everyone, because many wonders and signs were being done by the apostles. ⁴⁴All who believed were together and had all things in common; ⁴⁵they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need. ⁴⁶Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, ⁴⁷praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved.

Second Reading

Acts 3:1-10

Peter and John give what they have to a lame man – healing in the name of Jesus. And the lame man is able to join the community in prayer.

¹ One day Peter and John were going up to the temple at the hour of prayer, at three o'clock in the afternoon. ²And a man lame from birth was being carried in. People would lay him daily at the gate of the temple called the Beautiful Gate so that he could ask for alms from those entering the temple. ³When he saw Peter and John about to go into the temple, he asked them for alms. ⁴Peter looked intently at him, as did John, and said, 'Look at us.' ⁵And he fixed his attention on them, expecting to receive something from them. ⁶But Peter said, 'I have no silver or gold, but what I have I give you; in the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, stand up and walk.' ⁷And he took him by the right hand and raised him up; and immediately his feet and ankles were made strong. ⁸Jumping up, he stood and began to walk, and he entered the temple with them, walking and leaping and praising God. ⁹All the people saw him walking and praising God, ¹⁰and they recognized him as the one who used to sit and ask for alms at the Beautiful Gate of the temple; and they were filled with wonder and amazement at what had happened to him.
