Church Bazaar November 9th & 10th





Opening Devotions

Minutes Motion to accept last month's minutes made by Bruce Seconded by Myron

Treasurer's Report We recovered financially last month because our giving was up. We also had 5 Sundays last month. We are still minus \$3,622.32 for the year. Thrivent continues to do well. YTD gains were \$15,498.91. Myron raised the issue about the mulch not being able to pay the mulch bill. This is because we are behind financially for the year. Donna Had a question about the outreach amount shown in the bar graph Carol prepared. The question was does the endowment fund outreach count in this amount. It was said that the endowment funds are not traditionally included as this bar graph represents our budget only. but Ken will ask this question in the next Finance meeting.

Finance: Myron met with Jen from Joyful Noise and she approved the solar project. Myron needs to meet with the bank to find out the amount we would need to pay on a monthly basis. He needs this information to put together a final proposal. The finance committee also needs to develop a plan to finance the loan, as part of the proposal to be presented to the congregation for a vote.

Christian Ed: They did not meet this month. Sue Mariano has not mentioned anything about stepping down from Sunday School Superintendent. 10 children participated in Drama Camp this year. There were about 20 teens and adults who helped with Drama Camp. Nick Andersen did a great job!

Property: Today we had to do a toilet repair for \$525.00+. JN will pay for this. The Monday adult volunteers for the food pantry will be going through Safe Church training. The background checks have been done. The church clean-up was successful. Myron spoke with Jen about the JN floors. A final decision will be made when Jen returns from her leave of absence.

Worship and Music: Did not meet this month. Langdon preached last week. Donna will be preaching on August 4th.

Food pantry: 374 individuals from 162 households 14,446 pounds of food.

Welcome bags: Sue had welcome cards printed for the bags. The bag might include "A Small Catechism" and a copy of "The Lutheran's Welcome to Jesus", bookmarks made by the Bazaar crafters, one of our envelopes with our address on it, a map of West Warwick, maybe a box of cookies or something like that, a wooden cross pin and a letter from Pastor. .

Church picnic: To be held Sunday, September 8th. We should do it in the parking lot again. Sue and Ken will sponsor the bouncy house and continue with the other activities we've had in the past.

Youth Group will have a drive-in movie in August in the church parking lot.

- Nancy's surgery End of August. Chuck will fill in 9/1, 9/8 and 9/15. No 8AM service on 9/8 and 9/15.
- Ask if Nancy is okay with sharing her address for people to send her cards.

Property

- Only a few people signed up to help with retaining wall. Meet at 10am. Myron will be here at 9am.
- Meeting with Finance and solar person at end of August. Question raised what if hurricane or storm damages solar panels? Will insurance cover their replacement? We would have to pay RI Energy during the time the panels are not working.
- Joyful Noise supports putting on the solar panels paying 80% of the monthly cost of the panels' loan payment.

- Gas smell this past week in fellowship hall kitchen. Pilot light out? Maintenance company will be coming to service the stove – make sure it is working properly – new knobs will be replaced.
- Food pantry Janet got hit with a giant frozen piece of pork in the head and sustained a concussion. Myron will put up a guard rack to make sure the food doesn't fall out in the future.

Other items



Bible Readings for Sunday September 15th

First Reading

Genesis 12:1-4, 15:1-3

God promised to make a great nation of Abram. Abram listens to God and sets out from his homeland. But as he gets older and older, he brings his concern about being childless to God.

Now the Lord said to Abram, 'Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you. ²I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you, and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing. ³I will bless those who bless you, and the one who curses you I will curse; and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed.'

⁴ So Abram went, as the Lord had told him; and Lot went with him. Abram was seventy-five years old when he departed from Haran.

About 5 years past.

After these things the word of the Lord came to Abram in a vision, 'Do not be afraid, Abram, I am your shield; your reward shall be very great.' ²But Abram said, 'O Lord God, what will you give me, for I continue childless, and the heir of my house is Eliezer of Damascus?' ³And Abram said, 'You have given me no offspring, and so a slave born in my house is to be my heir.'

Second Reading

Genesis 15:4-15

God promises childless and aging Abram that a child of his own will be his heir and that his descendants will number as many as the stars. Abram trusts God's promise, though it will take hundreds of years to be fulfilled, and through this faith he is considered righteous.

⁴But the word of the Lord came to [Abram], 'This man [Eliezer of Damascus] shall not be your heir; no one but your very own flesh and blood shall be your heir.' ⁵He brought him outside and said, 'Look towards heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them.' Then he said to him, 'So shall your descendants be.' ⁶And he believed the Lord; and the Lord reckoned it to him as righteousness.

⁷ Then he said to him, 'I am the Lord who brought you from Ur of the Chaldeans, to give you this land to possess.' ⁸But he said, 'O Lord God, how am I to know that I shall possess it?' ⁹He said to him, 'Bring me a heifer three years old, a female goat three years old, a ram three years old, a turtle-dove, and a young pigeon.' ¹⁰He brought him all these and cut them in two, laying each half over against the other; but he did not cut the birds in two. ¹¹And when birds of prey came down on the carcasses, Abram drove them away.

¹² As the sun was going down, a deep sleep fell upon Abram, and a deep and terrifying darkness descended upon him. ¹³Then the Lord said to Abram, 'Know this for certain, that your offspring shall be aliens in a land that is not theirs, and shall be slaves there, and they shall be oppressed for four hundred years; ¹⁴but I will bring judgement on the nation that they serve, and afterwards they shall come out with great possessions. ¹⁵As for yourself, you shall go to your ancestors in peace; you shall be buried in a good old age.

Upcoming Commemorations

John Chrysostom, Bishop of Constantinople, died 407 Friday, September 13, 2024

John was a priest in Antioch and an outstanding preacher. His eloquence earned him the nickname "Chrysostom" ("golden mouth"). Appointed bishop of Constantinople, seat of the empire, he criticized corruption in the court. As a result, he was exiled by the empress.

Holy Cross Day Saturday, September 14, 2024

Helena, mother of Constantine, made a pilgrimage to the Holy Land and found what may be the actual site of Jesus' crucifixion. Her son built two churches there, and the dedication of one of them gave rise to this celebration of our Lord's victory on the cross.

Cyprian, Bishop of Carthage, martyr, died around 258 Monday, September 16, 2024

Cyprian served as a bishop during a time of great persecution of Christians. He insisted on receiving back those who had left the faith under duress. He also provided medical care during a severe epidemic.

Hildegard, Abbess of Bingen, died 1179 Tuesday, September 17, 2024

A mystic who was widely influential within the church, Hildegard advised and reproved kings and popes, wrote poems and hymns, and produced treatises in medicine, theology, and natural history. She was also a musician and artist.

Dag Hammarskjöld, renewer of society, died 1961 Wednesday, September 18, 2024

A Swedish diplomat, Hammarskjöld served as the second Secretary General of the United Nations until his death in a plane crash while trying to negotiate peace in present-day Zambia. His journal, published as Markings, revealed the depth of his Christian faith.

Nelson Wesley Trout, bishop, died 1996 (TFF) Friday, September 20, 2024

A native of Ohio, Trout served parishes in several parts of the United States before being elected bishop of the South Pacific District of the American Lutheran Church, the first African American Lutheran to serve in such a capacity.

Matthew, Apostle and Evangelist Saturday, September 21, 2024

Matthew (or Levi) was a tax collector in Capernaum for the Roman government. Tax collectors were frequently despised for dishonesty and for assisting the occupiers. Jesus nevertheless showed love for them, and chose Matthew to be a disciple.
