In many ways we do this at Emanuel. We pay a little extra each month to purchase green/renewable electricity. We recycle and pay for monthly pickup of paper, cans, glass, etc. Through the food pantry, we help to feed the hungry. We opened up our parsonage, when someone needed a place to stay. In a world that is more and more concerned with money and looking out for one's self, Emanuel presents an alternative way of living. We give – so that others can be cared for.

Now, this doesn't mean there shouldn't be or won't be problems within the church. The state of Maine has its share of problems too (an epidemic of opiate addiction and poverty to name two). But what it does mean is that we work through our problems honestly and in a loving way.

Last week we had a funeral with a big collation in the fellowship hall afterwards. However, since we share our space with the Joyful Noise Child Development Center, this posed a problem. The fellowship hall is normally full of children at this time. Plus they had plans to celebrate Chinese New Year's with a special Chinese food lunch.

In many places in this world, this would result in people fighting for their rights as tenants and owners, who knows lawyers might even be called in, but not in the church, not at Emanuel. We discussed the dilemma directly, honestly, and lovingly. And while the funeral was going on, I don't think many people realized that the kitchen was being shared and that a hundred kids were celebrating Chinese New Year's underneath them.

You see, the church should be an example of how life should be lived, especially when it comes to the problems of this world. How do we deal with personal conflicts? How do we deal with drug addiction? How do we deal with unemployment and poverty? How do we deal with domestic violence? Emanuel is touched by all these problems.

We have a chance to show the world what it looks like to live life knowing you are a child of God, knowing you are loved unconditionally, knowing that death does not have the last word, but rather the

love of God does. Knowing this frees us to address the problems of this world with grace, honesty and love.

Lent begins this month with Ash Wednesday on February 18th. Lent is a time for reflection on how we are living. This Lent let us live the way life should be. Let us live as the church.

Emanuel Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes December 11, 2014

Dinner and the meeting were held at the Wieboldt's home.

<u>Present:</u> Pastor Todd, Gwen Andersen, Pam Beck , Myron Gadoury, Beth Groleau, Lee Jacobs, Bruce Johnson, Disa Johnson, Glenn Johnson, Helen Maine, Donna Sennett, and Ken Wieboldt

Absent: Stephanie Chabot, Don Nester, Linda Sami, and Jim Schabek

Guests: Bob Maine, Sue Wieboldt

The meeting was called to order at 7:25 p.m. after a potluck dinner.

- Opening Devotions Pastor

 We shared our favorite Christmas memories.
- 2. Approved November Minutes Beth
- 3. Budget
 - a. Review November Budget
 - i. Treasurer's report Accepted
 - ii. Questions about what was included in the "Substitute" line and "Altar Guild, worship" lines in the budget. The "Altar Guild, worship" line includes: wine, candles, and the Celebrate inserts. The "Substitute" line is for supply pastors and substitute organists.
 - iii. Perhaps committees could talk in the future with the Finance about what gets included in each line; Finance is meeting on January 8, so Council Members/ reps from each committee are invited to that meeting. We request that <u>IF</u> Carol has the time, she provide information about what things get billed to each line with priorities for Property, Worship, Christian Education, and Administration.
 - iv. Finance Committee needs to know what income is coming from fundraisers and what the funds are supposed to pay for.
 - v. Questions about how best to get seed money for projects like the bazaar --- how best to track it?
 - 1. Bazaar Committee is having another sale on Sunday. Can that profit be used for seed money? Could Carol give the bazaar committee gift cards paid out of the Scrip program?
 - b. 2015 budget proposal --- Donna asked for an explanation about the "fair share" report. Bob Maine explained that this was the average weekly giving amount divided by the number of households. In the 2014 this amount was \$37.86.

\$189,000 / 96 households / 52 wks = \$37.86 avg. 2014 weekly offering

- c. 2015 Estimate of Giving letter --- sent out letter today explaining our situation and asking people to return their estimate of giving for 2015, so that we can try to fine tune the budget proposal.
 - i. Lee recommends that in the future, we do this earlier. We need to start this budget planning in October in the future.
- 4. Fuel Assistance --- See Beth's summary
 - a. Beth recommended we collect information so we can refer people to other agencies that already have such programs. They already have experience and procedures in place. Perhaps we can consider ways we can help to support those programs. Beth asked that Council members forward information to her as we find it.
 - b. Donna Sennett provided information to Beth about additional resources and more specific contact information for some of the resources.
 - c. Lee endorsed Myron's suggestion that we consider using money from the Endowment Fund and move it to the Pastor's Discretionary Fund for use if we decide to help with heating assistance in the future.
 - d. If we do make a donation for someone's home heating, the check should be made out to the heating oil company, and the address where the delivery is supposed to be made on the memo line.
 - e. Beth will continue to update information. She will ask to meet with Shari Japic to learn what resources Shari knows about. Donna suggested that we check with Margaret Teehan for advice, also.
- 5. Recording past church records in log books updates:
 - a. Kym is going back and recording everything in the ledger.
 - b. Question about storing them in something fireproof. Many people thought the books should be stored in a fire-proof safe. Myron will buy a safe.
- 6. Constitution Job Description Update --- Pastor Todd has the information now and will work on it.
- 7. Other Items
 - a. Disa asked about Synod delegates; Pastor will put an article in the Herald; we need to get a male delegate to serve with Diane Gadoury. If no one is willing to be a delegate, Disa Johnson volunteered to go.
 - b. Beth asked if we need to do anything about the nominees for the Endowment Committee?
 - i. We have contacted most people; Beth will ask Hank Richter formally; Glenn will talk to Don Schabek.
 - ii. Glenn will ask people for an answer on Sunday. (Make sure they know that terms are staggered.)
 - iii. The people need to be elected at the Annual Meeting.
 - c. Guidelines for new keys:

- i. We want to limit people with keys to the office to the office staff and Finance. Some people need to use the copier, so the Council approved moving the old copier to the library. Michael Gadoury will take care of keeping it maintained.
- d. Food Pantry
 - i. Ask people to bring more food or to buy Scrip cards to donate to the panty or to give cash.
 - ii. Council wants to keep the food pantry as is for now, and highlight the need to the congregation. Have people make announcement each week; have people put the food they bring into a basket at the entry to the nave, and have kids bring it up to the altar with the offering. Each Council member is asked to bring a food item on December 14.
 - iii. Donna told an idea she is doing. She is having a big party at Christmas and asked her guests to bring items for the church Food Pantry.
 - iv. We will raise awareness at church, and for now, will continue to supplement out of the church budget and then review what is happening at a future meeting. Sue Wieboldt will bring in one of her big baskets on Sunday. We will advertise things that we need.
- e. Council Members do we have the nominees we need for the Annual Meeting?
 - i. We need 14 members plus the President, Vice President, and Pastor. We need one more person for the Council; Ken will talk to Jim Schabek, Don Nester, and Stephanie Chabot to see whether those who are on the Council now are willing to continue. Ken will also talk to Don Schabek to see if he is interested in being a nominee at the Annual Meeting. Myron will ask Margaret Teehan.
- 8. Goals for next year: Please be thinking of what our Council Goals might be.
- 9. Closing
