A Fresh Start

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

A friend shared with me the other day the resolutions she's made for 2015. She was excited about the new possibilities. Her husband, she said, was less excited and hadn't bothered to make any resolutions for himself. So, she helped him by writing up a list of resolutions for him. I can only imagine his excitement.

Many people like to use the occasion of a new year to change their lives (and others' too). Resolutions are made in the hope of living differently: getting in better shape physically, reading smarter books, saving more money, being better friends, getting closer to God.

These are all good things to aspire to, but the fact is most resolutions fall apart before the end of January and people go back to the way they were living before – in ways they are not completely happy with, in ways that cause them dis-ease.

What are people to do? Next year people can try again. Next year people can make new resolutions. But we don't have to wait that long for a fresh start.

Baptism in the life of Christians serves as the point in time when we get a fresh start. The Apostle Paul went so far as to say in baptism we are put to death and then raised to new life in Christ. That is indeed a fresh start. But for most of us – our baptisms are a distant memory, something that happened long ago. But baptism – it turns out – is more about our futures and our present – than it is about our past.

Baptism offers us a fresh start every day, but it is more than just recommitting ourselves with resolutions to be better people. Baptism is God claiming us as God's children. It's God's promise of love and forgiveness for all eternity. Baptism is God's love for us, even now, with all our faults. And baptism is God's assurance that ultimately we will get to a place when all our dis-ease is no more. No more pain, no more loneliness, no more hunger, no more worry. God promise us to bring us to a point where "God will be all in all". This is where we are headed – whether we make resolutions for ourselves or not.

I heard a story a while back about a student who was struggling to write a paper. The student wanted an 'A' or maybe even needed an 'A' to keep his scholarship. But the pressure and anxiety was making it nearly impossible for him to write the paper. When the student finally shared with the professor what was going on, the professor said, "If you need an 'A', I'll give you an 'A', I'll record it in my books today. Now, story worrying and go write your paper."

This is the type of grace and love God showers on us in baptism – a love that sets us free to live boldly, with confidence – because we know where we are going. And this sets us free to truly love one another – even those who are difficult to love.

This new year let us be resolved to live into this love that God has for us now and in the future. Happy New Year!





PROPERTY REPORT

- The Church Master Key Lock project is complete and the whole Church has been rekeyed. All keys requested have been passed out.
- Please refrain from taping any papers on the Church walls. The tape is hard to remove, takes valuable time from the custodians duties, and damages the paint on the walls we have bulletin boards for this purpose.
- We have some paint peeling on the wall where the AC Units are located. Phil and I will be addressing this by repairing these areas.
- As we are starting a new year the property Committee gearing up for the ARMY of state
 and town inspectors who will be coming in the spring. We are in pretty good shape but
 every year it seems they add another inspection for another code and find something.
 This past year was the first time we had our kitchen stove and hood inspected. It cost
 over \$1000.00 to rectify the citation and is now an added cost each year of \$500.00 to
 keep the Exhaust duct certified.
- The New London Staircase has been gated off for the winter and will re-open after the
 winter weather is gone. In order to have the staircase stay open the walkway would
 have to be maintained in the winter (snow removal / Ice melt). At this time this is not
 financially feasible to do.
- The bazar committee has made a good profit and will be providing funds to install Air Conditioning in the Fellowship Hall. It is their hope there will be more functions in the summer months because it will be more accommodating. What a GREAT IDEA. Going forward I will be getting quotes to accomplish this. I will first check on the feasibility of removing the center AC IUnit from the Sanctuary and re-locating it to the Hall. Presently we turn the center unit off during the service anyway and the two end units seem to do the job. Let's see what the contractor who installed it recommends. This past month we have had a skunk on our property. It was removed by DEM and was reported as rebid. With this being said we must make sure that we do not discard food outside for the animals as we do not want to attract them. I will also talk with the day care and remind them to keep the doors to the dumpster closed.

- A number of years ago we had the Church re-lamped with T8 bulbs and cfl's. This was a great savings in energy for Emanuel with a short payback. Going forward now the technology has again changed with the advent of the LED Technology. While the savings is not as great going from Fluorescent to LED we have found that if ballast goes or the fixture has the round tubes it is cheaper to replace the whole fixture with LED Light fixtures. We have started doing this in the Day Care. The Led Fixture does not have any bulbs to replace but actual LED Array's which are supposed to light for 35 years. The cost of the fixture is only \$20.00.
- Coat Closet has a number of coats in it that have been left there for months. If no one claims them we will give them out to food pantry persons who are in need.
- We need to keep the coat closet functional and clean. Space is limited and in the winter months the racks get full of winter coats during Church services. We do not want to have clothes and coats donated and dropped off in the Coat Room.
 WE do not have a program for this and just means that I have to take them to one of the bins in town. It would be best if you took them to one of those bins, Salvation Army, or one of the local Churches who has that program. Check with the Church Office for which local Churches accept clothes. If you have children's clothes to donate you might want to check with Joyful Noise and bring them downstairs to their office.. Contact them first otherwise they just put them in the coat closet and again I have to dispose of them.
 If you are dropping off bottles or other items for a cause, please contact the committee chair of that Cause and let them know to pick them up. We cannot leave them there for weeks.

There are some plastic bins in the Coat Closet. Please remove them or we will need to dispose of them.

• Going forward our next project is to make better use of our space by cleaning out the attic and basement. We would like to hear from everyone who has anything stored in these areas so we can identify the items and put them in a log.

The log will be kept at the respected areas and will contain the name of the person or committee, a description of what is being stored, and its location. In this way everyone will know what is in the attic.

The attic will be cleaned out of any items not identified. We will then identify with painted lines storage areas with assigned numbers.

After the basement is cleaned out we will address the water issues in the basement and determine what our options are for reducing/eliminating this issue so we can use the basement for storage of hard items.

WE do not wish to discard any items that you have stored but we must hear from you so we will know this, otherwise we will discard the items.

Next Sunday after Church service I will be available to anyone who wishes to enter the attic or basement to identify items.

The cleanout will start to take place the end of January

The meeting was called to order at 7:05

Opening Devotions

2015 Budget

Pastor

- Report about shortfall in 2014 budget predicted to be \$11K.
- Finance prepared a draft budget according to the anticipated income based on 2014:
 - Discussion:
 - What about the connection with the new ideas from Stewardship about not focusing on money, but on time and talents?
 - Suggested we follow finance recommendations.
 - Concerns about cutting Administrative Assistant, Sunday School
 - Proposal to ask people to increase their giving by 10% if they can and to encourage consistent and faithful week-to-week giving, even if the amount remains the same. A mailing and an event are planned for December 7 to encourage this.
 - Inform people in the congregation about the situation now and ask them to come to the annual meeting with their ideas.
 - On Sunday January 11 we will have a Time & Talents event during the coffee hour where people can sign-up to help with Emanuel's different ministries. A letter about all kinds of Stewardship will be going out soon
 - Myron shared information about the Westfield Church Capital Campaign from Killingly Ct where they are asking for public support in the local newspaper.
- Motion to approve the Proposal to communicate the financial situation to the congregation, to include a summary of possible cuts if the level of giving in 2015 stays the same as in 2014. The letter should be careful not to panic the

congregation, but should have a sense of "measured urgency." (10 yeas, 1 nay.)

• Date of Emanuel meeting to be January 25 with a snow date of February 1.

January <u>9-20</u> Bob and Helen will be in Florida, so someone else will need to track the 2015 estimates of giving information that comes in.

Next Steps for Engaging Youth in Emanuel's Ministries Pastor

- Pam's idea --- gift card program
- Ask committees to discuss the four questions Pastor proposed:
 - If we were not constrained by money and people, what could we do differently with our ministries to transform more people's lives?
 - Given the money we have and the people we have, what could we do differently with our ministries to transform more people's lives?
 - How might the young people of Emanuel play a bigger role in the ministry so that their lives might be transformed.
 - Is a similar ministry already being done in our community? Would it make sense for us to join with that ministry and partner with them to accomplish our goals?

Update on getting Job descriptions in Constitution

• Pastor sent e-mail to Chris Stewart, Don Nester, and Bob Maine. Pastor received the documents that they had. Bob gave advice that they be placed in an appendix to make it a simpler process. (Place a note in the continuing resolutions that the job descriptions are located in a specific appendix.)

Council Needs to Recommend 5 People for the Mission Endowment Committee; one person from Council

- Will be on staggered terms so they don't all go off at once.
- Responsible for:
 - Distributing the funds according to the guidelines specified.
 - Encouraging others to contribute
 - Bob Maine, Carol Johnson, Glenn Johnson, Don Schabek, Hank Richter, Eric Johnson, Marge LeBeau, Beth Groleau, Ray Nunes, Donna Lucier were nominated.

Set Date for Annual Meeting

• Suggestion to change the date of the January 8th Council meeting to January 15, with the annual meeting January 25. Approved

Kitchen in Fellowship Hall Myron

• Kitchen is operational again; stove is now back in middle of hood, side of hood restored; stove inspected by contractor, pilots cleaned and adjusted, all burners cleaned. Myron rebuilt fan turbine/repaired motor. Other work needs to be done, and Myron has made the plans to do the rest of the work.

Myron noted that the stove is in good shape and in the future, he recommends that we replace the Hood /Halon system so we can cook anytime whether for Day Care or Church.

• Church can cook 12 times a year on average. Day care can only heat food up per State Fire Code Board of Appeal and Review Court session.

Office Record Keeping Myron

We are no longer recording things in the ledger; they are being kept in the
data base. Myron's concern is having a record for the future in hard copies.
In the future, the software might not work and we could lose the data and our
church records.

Savings – **How much do we want to keep in the savings?** Myron

- We used to allocate something for savings in the budget every year, but we haven't been able to do it for the past couple of years.
- Myron would like to make our goal having a reserve of six months of expenses as our goal.
- Pam would like to get 25 people to give \$1000 each and invest it with Thrivent and leave it there to build (compound interest).
- When we get the mortgage paid off, we will have \$25,000 more each year to use in some way.
- Since the budget is about \$200, 000, our goal will be to build to \$100, 000 and put as a future item for the council how to get there. Motion made and seconded. Bob Maine noted that we will not be able to get there until our consistent giving supports the budget we adopt. Approved, no nays.

The meeting adjourned at 9:18 with the Lord's Prayer.
