stories of God's Spirit at work and hearing them helps all of us to recognize where God may be at work in our life or where we may need God.





The **Endowment Fund Committee** will meet this Sunday, November 8th in the pastor's office after the 10:30 service to make the final decisions on spending the 2015 funds.



Hello Emanuel friends!

I recently attended Doris Stone's funeral and Gwen was there and asked me for advice on how the church can serve youth better. She said there is no youth group right now, but Todd assured me that there are still occasional activities, which is great!

I thought about this on my drive home to Massachusetts and a few things came to me.

I remembered my Mom's advice when I started as the youth leader for Emanuel. She said "Kristina, you don't have to worry about a thing. As long as everyone comes back in one piece and no one gets pregnant, you are doing a good job." Although this probably doesn't rank as "sage advice", it has a truth to it.

The number one and most important skill needed to run a youth event is the ability to show up. Sure some activities seem cooler than others, and our egos might want our event to be the best ever, but BEING there shows the youth that you care. And that is huge.

Next, feel free to steal with pride. Think back to what you thought was the best youth event (for me, Marge and Melissa's Amazing Race event comes to mind) and do it again.

If doing something that someone else came up with feels weird to you, then go with something that you, your-self, are jazzed about. Like picking apples and making pies? Offer to bring some church youths with you. Feel passionately about the Easter Breakfast? Start planning for it and include some kids. Knitting is your thing? I've read that young skateboarders have been learning how to knit so that they can create their own, cool patterns for caps to show off to their friends (and maybe encourage them to make some for newborn babies or cancer patients too).

Doing things that worked in the past might not be the right formula for the present. Talking to the youth and finding out what would make their church life more rich and fun could help the program take a whole new and exciting direction.

One other thing that comes to mind is that maybe the "youth leader" paradigm doesn't work for Emanuel right now. Being the youth leader, or even sharing it, is a lot of work. When it is left to one or two people, and it is a volunteer position, it can lead to eventual burn out, or what some might call exhaustion. Especially if you are someone like Marge or Melissa who feels so passionately about the youth and their engagement in the church community. (I'm not saying that either burned out, just using these two passionate leaders in example.) At Baptism, we all promise to help and guide the youth on their journey. As a community in Christ, any one of us can run an event, lead a youth Bible study, take the youth to Hammo/Calumet, bake a pie, teach a song, have a fund raiser, bring the youth to a nursing home, go caroling...you get the picture.

One of the great things about Emanuel is the community. As the great community that you are, you can involve the youth in everything that is going on in the church. As a warning, it can be tempting to invite youth to be the manual labor. Don't do that. At least not all the time. But rather, involve youth in the events for the church in a fun way.

Finally, I think that if you take a look around, you will probably see that you already DO a lot of age-mixed events and maybe the angst that Gwen is feeling just shows a little need for a few more age-specific events. If you agree, pray on it. God will place the inspiration on your hearts.



Emanuel Lutheran Church Council Meeting September 10, 2015

Agenda and Minutes

<u>Present:</u> Pastor Todd, Gwen Andersen, Pam Beck, Carolyn Duprey, Myron Gadoury, Beth Groleau, Lee Jacobs, Bruce Johnson, Disa Johnson, Glenn Johnson, Helen Maine, Kathy Plante, Linda Sami, Donna Sennett, Margaret Teehan, and Ken Wieboldt.

The meeting was called to order at 7:00.

- 1. Opening Devotions: A reading from John's Gospel --- Lazarus's resurrection after being dead 4 days. Are there times in our lives when things just seem to be falling apart? It can seem like that at home or at church sometimes. When things look bad for us, we need to remember that God is always there for us, that God loves us, and we are forgiven. Remember to rest, and take a deep breath, and then go on.
- 2. Approve August Minutes Approved as written
- 3. Finance Glenn Johnson
 - a. Review and approve August Budgets
 - i. We are 2/3 through the year; we are \$7,000 behind, and have been deficit spending.
 - ii. Treasurer's Report approved
 - b. Ways to deal with 2015 budget deficit
 - i. We need to continue to communicate to the congregation that Emanuel's offerings have fallen short this year, and that we have borrowed \$7,000 from our savings so far and may need to borrow more.
 - Lee Jacobs and Beth Groleau will make announcements at both services on Sunday, September 13, paraphrasing Pastor Todd's letter in the Herald, and asking for extra contributions.
 - ii. Fundraisers, including food-based fund-raisers
 - 1. Spaghetti supper and other suppers for several months before the end of the year

- 2. Make a formal request to Mary Schabek and the Bazaar Committee to contribute some of the proceeds from the Bazaar (maybe for the roof repairs).
- 3. What about a coffee house like we used to do? (Linda Sami will organize.)
- 4. Chuck wants to do a Christmas concert the Sunday after Thanksgiving.
- 5. Myron will organize a Ham and Bean supper in November.
- 6. Ask Ida if it would be possible to do another music show.
- 7. Can Council members each make a contribution as leaders of the congregation to make up the remaining deficit? Each Council member, please think about that, and do whatever you can do. (This includes writing for a Thrivent Action Team.)
- 8. Bruce asked about what has happened to the money that people have already given as extra offerings? The response was, that all the offerings, including extra ones, have still left us \$7,000 short this year and unable to pay for the second drain on the fellowship hall roof.
- 9. Glenn reminded us that Sarah Groleau will be here on September 27th to help people sign up as Thrivent Associate Members.
- 10. For a very limited time (due to a NASCAR sponsorship) you can use the word "Driven" as a promo code on your Associate Membership on-line application and the normal membership fee of \$19.95 is waived. This special promotional membership entitles you to sponsor one (1) Thrivent Action Team. Note: This offer may end at any time.
- 11.Beth reported that, at St. Andrew's, Pastor Lisa Hazelwood put paper slips out with ideas for writing Thrivent Action Teams.
- c. Projected fundraising needs for 2015-16 NOT DISCUSSED.
- d. How to better support Emanuel's fundraising efforts
 - Pam suggested we check into training from the Synod training for stewardship. Glenn looked into this: on Wednesday, September 23rd, there will be a free training at Christ the King in Holliston, MA. Interested Council members could attend.

4. Property

- a. Approval for installation of 2^{nd} drain pipe by Furey Roofing need about \$1,100
- b. Myron explained the problem and proposed plan for the drain.
- c. The drain we already had put in is on the lower part of the roof, and it might take care of the water this year, but if it doesn't, then we will have another leak in the ceiling over the kitchen. That cost us \$2,500 to repair last winter.
- d. Since we are already \$7,000 in the hole this year, it is difficult to approve this additional expense. **The Council voted NOT to spend the money at this time.**

5. Other Items

a. Data Bases Bob Maine

- i. Bob Maine will track stewardship pledges for this year, but it will be the last year he does so.
- ii. Bob raised the issue that right now we have 4 data bases --church office, Financial Secretary, and Bob's Stewardship data
 base as well as the 130th Anniversary Committee's data base. It
 would be helpful to have one that each group could access,
 partly to reduce duplication and share current information.
- iii. Pastor Todd suggested that we get a subcommittee together to investigate what is available and come up with a plan. His parents' church uses a program that is online. He will begin by looking for information about what there is, how it works, and whether it is protected. It was suggested that Bob Maine, Walter Phaneuf, and Michael Gadoury be asked to help, and also consider asking other people who might be Bob's and Walter's replacements in the future.
- b. Ken asked all Council members to study the budget to make sure we all understand it.
- c. Gwen reported that the 130th Anniversary Committee would like to do a Swedish Dinner in October as a fund-raiser for the anniversary celebration expenses, such as postage and the down payment for the West Valley Inn. (The preliminary committee will meet next Wednesday, October 16 at Carolyn Duprey's house to start planning the Swedish Dinner.)

 Myron volunteered to write for a Thrivent Action Team to teach a class on how to make Korv, and then supply the Swedish Sausage for the dinner.

d. That fundraiser was approved by the Council.

- i. Kathy Plante suggested that we consider having the dinner after the 10:30 service as a luncheon.
- e. Donna suggested that we make a folder and keep track of Thrivent Action Teams and see if we can print out the applications we write so that others can use them as a model for their applications. We are looking for someone who could organize and keep this information and make it available to the congregation.
- f. So far, Emanuel has either organized or benefitted from 5 Action Teams. Myron Gadoury got one to grow vegetables with and for Teen Challenge. Ken Wieboldt wrote one for the snacks for Drama Camp. Michael Groleau and the Groleau's neighbor, Francine Vasquez, organized them to get groceries for Emanuel's Food Pantry. Beth Groleau got one to buy quilt batting for Ellie's Circle.
- g. Beth Groleau reported that the Christian Education Committee has developed a new procedure for Communion Set-up and distribution of the wafers so that the gluten-free wafers are less likely to be contaminated by gluten. There will be articles in the Herald to educate the congregation, a sign made for the sacristy to remind people who prepare for and clean up from Communion, and Lee Jacobs will send out the new procedure to the people who volunteer for the responsibility.
- 6. Closing: The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer at 8:55 p.m.
- 7. Next meeting Thursday, October 8, 7:00 p.m.
