And by "church" I mean the gathering of believers on Sunday morning, e.g. worship. Getting kids there usually means you've got to make sure they're dressed, fed, you've got to pull them away from other activities and corral them into the car. So, why do we bother? Why do we go through all this effort to get our kids to church?

When our kids were younger, things were simple (or at least simpler). Our kids came to church because we were coming to church. They didn't complain, because they either didn't know how to talk yet or didn't realize complaining was an option. Things have changed since then.

Now that they are older they freely offer up their opinions, e.g. "Church is boring." They are also more involved with activities like soccer, baseball, and road races that sometime occur on Sunday mornings. Perhaps we should just say, "No" to these activities that infringe on the time that was once set aside for church. I am after all a pastor and our kids are pastor's kids, but it can be hard to tell them they can't play on the baseball team, because they have to go to church. We're selective about when we take this stand, because ideally church is a place of grace and ultimately we'd like them to want to come to church.

My kids have a weird relationship with church. At some level they think they go to church because I'm the pastor and that's my job. But this is not unlike many other kids. Often a parent or grandparent wants them to come to church and so they go along because they want to make them happy. It won't be until later that they'll get to freely choose whether they come to church or not.

Today many kids don't come to church because their parents choose not to come. Family life has become so hectic that even parents who would like to bring their families to worship – sometimes opt to stay home because Sunday morning is the only time when they can rest and get caught up on the chores that have built up over the week.

But despite these forces that work against us getting to worship on Sunday – I recently found myself hoping and praying in a new way that our children find a home in the church and continue to come as adults long after Jill and I are gone. Perhaps it's because our kids are getting older now. Carly especially, as she becomes a teenager, is easier to imagine as an adult.

As our children become adults and we fade into the past – it's becoming clearer to me that it is the church that will become more and more the holder of life's truths and the source of encouragement and hope that I want for our kids.

As children, like they are now, I want them to come to church to learn the history of the Bible – about Noah, Abraham and Sarah, the Israelites, Moses, King David and Jesus too. Much of western thought and literature is based on the Bible. Even in the secular world Biblical and religious references pop up all the time. Without a familiarity with them, they will miss out on a certain depth and richness of life.

The church also serves to reinforce morality: do unto others as you would have them do unto **you, love one another, care for those in need. These are the foundation of much of the world's** morality. But perhaps the more important teachings of the church are the ones that are harder to grasp and believe.

Forgiveness, for instance, for others and for ourselves, that the way out of failure and mistakes is not through hiding, covering it up, pretending that it didn't happen, but in acknowledging the truth, saying we're sorry, and working to make amends. This is where second chances come from (and 3rd, 4th, and 5th chances too). Another of the church's teachings, that is not readily obvious, is the revelation that we are intimately connected with the other 7 billion people we share this planet with, that they are not strangers, but our brothers and sisters. In fact, we are not just connected to other people, but to the earth and all of God's creation. And also that death is not the most powerful thing in the universe. That God can transform death and suffering into a new beginning. These are the teachings we need to keep hearing and be reminded of again and again.

Ultimately I want our kids to come to church so that they will know the true God – not an angry God, not a capricious God, not a God of fame, beauty or money, but the God that is revealed in Jesus. One that is intimately close to them and loving, and that no matter where they end up in life, no matter what trouble they may find themselves in, they can know for sure that they are not alone, that God is there with them, and loves them, and will see them through. And if **they know this as the truth, then they don't have to live a life full of anxiety and worry, but** have the possibility to live confident, hopeful, and courageous lives.

This is why I want our kids, and all kids, to come to church.

Temple talk "Ask, Thank, Tell" by Charles Lane

It has been more than a year now that a few members have been meeting monthly to study about a year-round stewardship program and to create events on a quarterly basis.

God comes down to us with love and grace was the emphasis in the first quarter. Everything we have comes down from God. We are stewards of his possessions. In the second quarter we recognize our strengths with our time and talents that God has given to us. We had two opportunities to sign up to help our congregation provide for worship and activities sponsored by Emanuel. Thank you to everyone that volunteers their services in this way. In the third quarter, we recognized the reaching out to our community through our neighboring St Therese Church, maintaining our food bank, sponsoring our Day Care Center, helping members in time of need, and numerous connections to the community by individual members.

To tell the truth, I had the fourth phase on my mind all year, The Annual Response. Is it going to be the same old thing, asking for money? A letter from Pastor, a Sunday to collect pledges, time and talent sheets, maybe a dinner or cottage meeting to tell the story, and a few phone calls to complete the numbers for the year. The committee records the numbers mixed in with some trends of past years, and creates the budget for the annual meeting.

Recently I read "Ask, Thank, Tell" by Charles Lane, highly recommended by Bishop Hazelwood. Shouldn't we take a look at what we accomplished in 2015 before we look at 2016? Shouldn't we TALK about what we are doing, Thank everyone for what they have done, and then ASK what the congregation wants to do in 2016? That is what we are planning to do for the fourth quarter. Our vision is to line up temple talks for October and November to tell the story. The past three weeks we had work to do on the Fellowship Hall roof drains that would cost \$3500. We went over our goal last Sunday. Thank you all for recognizing this need and allowing us to complete this task as soon as possible. On Sunday, December 6th, we will have a luncheon after worship to celebrate our year-round program and to ask the congregation what it wants to do in 2016. We will distribute Estimate of giving cards and Time & Talent Sheets during the morning service and collect them in the offering and during the luncheon. Hope to see you on the 6th. Your attendance will help us to prepare for 2016.


